Instead, the results were considered as more or less disastrous by many, including representatives of educational authorities. As to reading skills, it was considered 'normal' for deaf students to reach a maximal level corresponding to the 3 rd grade; as to their writing it was difficult to make any comparisons to hearing children because it showed many 'peculiar' grammatical errors and mistakes not found in texts from the latter SVARTHOLM, Personal agency : The capacity for intentional, self-directed behaviour, especially in face of obstacles such as a lack of opportunity or discrimination.
